Background

- The Federal Carbon Pollution Pricing System has been enacted through the Greenhouse Gas Pollution Pricing Act (the Act), which received Royal Assent on June 21, 2018.
- The Act is composed of 2 key pricing components:
 - Fuel charge (administered by CRA), and
 - Output-Based Pricing System for large emitters (administered by Environment and Climate Change Canada).
- The fuel charge began to apply in Manitoba, New Brunswick, Ontario and Saskatchewan on April 1, 2019 and will begin to apply in Nunavut and Yukon on July 1, 2019 (listed provinces), and an announcement has been made for the fuel charge to apply in Alberta on January 1, 2020.

Registration

- A person is required to be registered as a road carrier in respect of a type of fuel that is a **qualifying motive fuel** if the person uses fuel of that type in a **specified commercial vehicle** in a listed province.
- This requirement does not apply if the person is, or is required to be, registered as a distributor, a specified air carrier, an air carrier, a specified marine carrier, a marine carrier, a specified rail carrier or a rail carrier, in respect of that type of fuel.

Qualifying motive fuel - gasoline, light fuel oil (diesel), marketable natural gas, or propane.

Registration

Specified commercial vehicle - a vehicle that satisfies the following three criteria.

1. The vehicle must be used for commercial transportation of passengers or goods by road between provinces or between a place in Canada and a place outside Canada.
2. Second, the vehicle must have 2 axels and a gross vehicle weight greater than 11 797 kg, 3 axels regardless of weight or a gross vehicle weight greater than 11 797 kg with its trailer.
3. Third, the vehicle must not be a recreational vehicle such as a motor home, pickup truck with attached camper or bus if used solely for personal use or enjoyment of a particular individual or for the personal use or enjoyment of another person at the particular individual's expense.

Registration

Timing of Registration

A person that is required to be registered as a road carrier in respect of a type of fuel must apply for registration before the later of April 1, 2019, for Manitoba, New Brunswick, Ontario and Saskatchewan; July 1, 2019, for Nunavut and Yukon; January 1, 2020 for Alberta ⁽¹⁾ ; and the day that the person first uses fuel in a specified commercial vehicle in a listed province.

(1) Based on the June 13 announcement by the Department of Finance of the Government's intent to apply the federal pollution pricing fuel charge in Alberta effective January 1, 2020.

Application

- A registered road carrier will generally pay the fuel charge at the pump.



- A registered road carrier will report and pay a fuel charge on fuel used within a listed province or request a rebate for fuel purchased in a listed province but used outside the listed province.

Application

Reporting Period

- A registered road carrier will have the following reporting periods (quarterly) each year:
 - January 1, 20XX – March 31, 20XX
 - April 1, 20XX – June 30, 20XX
 - July 1, 20XX – September 30, 20XX
 - October 1, 20XX – December 31, 20XX
- The return and payment deadline is one month after the end of the reporting period.
 - Example - If the end of the reporting period is June 30 then the filing and payment deadline is July 31.

Calculation of Charge

- Fuel charge amount = $A \times B$ where
 - A is the Net Fuel Quantity
 - B is the fuel rate applicable to the fuel type
- Before we can calculate the fuel charge amount, you need to calculate the Net Fuel Quantity.

4

Calculation of Charge

- Net Fuel Quantity = **A - B** where

A is the total of the following quantities:

- Quantity of fuel used in a specified commercial vehicle in a listed province during a reporting period (quarterly); and
- Quantity of fuel removed from a supply tank of a specified commercial vehicle in a listed province during a reporting period (quarterly).

B is the total quantity of fuel transferred into a supply tank of a specified commercial vehicle of the person in the listed province during a reporting period (quarterly).

Calculation of Charge

- If the **Net Fuel Quantity** calculated is a positive amount the registered road carrier will report and pay a fuel charge amount.
- If the **Net Fuel Quantity** calculated is a negative amount the registered road carrier is eligible for a rebate.

Calculating Net Fuel Quantity

1. Calculate the Average Kilometres Per Litre factor (KPL) for your fleet

$$\text{KPL} = \frac{\text{Total KM travelled in all jurisdictions for the period}}{\text{Total Litres of all fuel purchased for the period in all jurisdictions}}$$

Suppose ABC Transport Inc. uses only diesel for its fleet and has calculated its KPL to be 2.5. In this example, this ratio would be a result of using the above formula which takes into consideration total KMs travelled in all jurisdictions and fuel purchases in all jurisdictions for the period.

2. To determine the Net Fuel Quantity, ABC Transport Inc. will need to identify the total KMs travelled and the total fuel purchased in Listed Provinces for the period.

Suppose ABC Transport Inc. has the following rounded KM data and diesel fuel purchases

Other Consideration

- **Non-Resident Business Number**
